About the traffic icon

When you are receiving traffic information, a traffic icon appears on the Map. The traffic icon changes colour to indicate the severity of traffic conditions.

Red	High severity	Traffic is heavily congested or stopped.
Grey	No data	Traffic data has not updated.



About traffic cameras




